



Western Kane County Special Service District is operating the Burn Pit on Cedar Mountain for the second year. Appropriate use of the burn pit will be monitored throughout the season. If a gate and ticketing system becomes necessary, it will be implemented at that time.

REGULATIONS

Please note the following restrictions. Failure to comply with these restrictions may lead to closure of the burn pit at any time:

MATERIALS

All material must be natural and burnable including tree trimmings and shrubs.

PROHIBITED

There is ABSOLUTELY NO dumping of commercial or residential waste. No garbage or metal allowed.

HAZARDS



No hazardous materials or construction material of any kind.

STUMPS

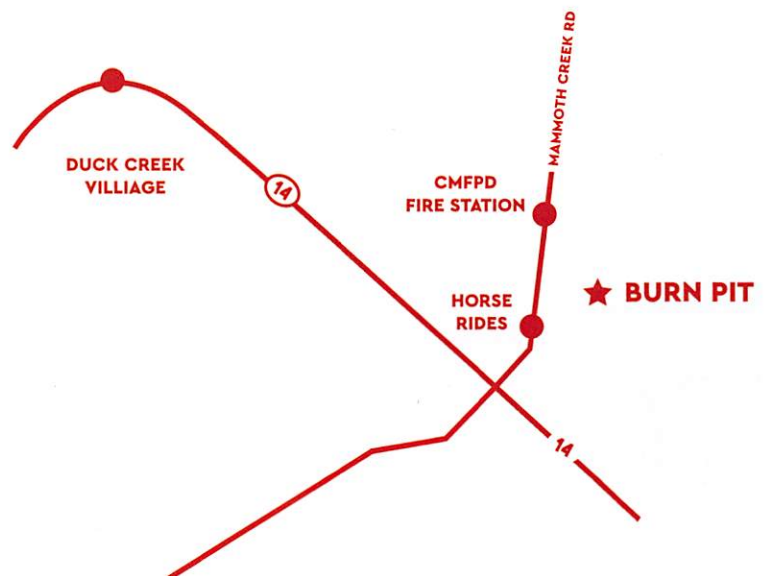
Stumps MUST be separated from the main burn pit pile and placed in the designated area.

LOCATION

From Highway 14, turn North on Mammoth Creek Road. Proceed past the horse rentals and post office. Turn right at the sign towards the dumpsters. Continue past the dumpsters and pull all the way through to the appropriate area.

-  Open 7 days a week during daylight hours.
-  Any person caught dumping prohibited materials may be cited, fined and required to remove the items from the pit.

DUST ABATEMENT



The bulk of roads in the District received an application of magnesium chloride to reduce the dust in 2022 and will again this Spring/Summer. Road conditions may vary widely due to the effects of the heavy snow this Winter.

- Drive slowly through subdivisions, the speed limit is 25 MPH or less.
- Drive on the correct side of the road.
- Be alert to oncoming or stopped traffic.
- Slow down on blind curves and dips or crests of roadways.

SNOW REMOVAL



Snow removal enables emergency access to our community in the Winter. It is a time-consuming and dangerous process, often being performed during blizzard conditions or after dark. Primary roads in subdivisions are cleared first, with secondary roads the next priority. Then roads are widened and fire hydrants cleared of snow. To ensure a safe and efficient process:

- Do not park vehicles on the road. They will be ticketed and towed.
- To report a parked vehicle call the Kane County Dispatch non-emergency number at 435-644-2349.
- Do not push snow from your driveway into the roadway, your neighbor's property, or in front of fire hydrants.
- Monitor the weather and plan accordingly as snow removal of District roads may not accommodate your plans to leave or access your property.
- Snow removal personnel are NOT allowed to assist stuck motorists.
